The Galician Horse



The Galician Horse

- Weight: 165 - 300 kg.
- Height at the withers: 120 - 140 cm.
- Coat color: bay, dark bay, black and red.
- Color is usually solid, the standard does not accept dapples, mottled and albino.
- The head of these horses is proportional to the body, the ears are small and pointed, the neck is short and muscular, the eyes are expressive. The chest and body of this breed are strong and powerful, the shoulders are straight, the back is short and compact with a low set tail, strong and beautifully shaped legs with small hooves.
- They have good health and stamina. They are hardworking and energetic, kind and loyal, docile and clever. They have a very smooth, sharp trot, which makes riding comfortable for the rider.
- An additional plus is considered easy trainability and obedience. The horses tolerate heat and cold well and are unpretentious in food. The Galician horse is widely used in Mexico for agricultural work, riding, carrying loads, and harnessing.

The Hispano-Arab Purebred horse



The Hispano-Arab Purebred horse

- Weight: 360 - 540 kg.
- Height at the withers: 140 - 160 cm.
- Coat colors: red, gray or bay.
- Smooth profile, rarely with a "pike nose", thin graceful neck, sloping shoulders, wide deep chest, flat back, wide croup, well-set tail. The legs are strong, the hooves are firm.
- This is a riding horse with a special aptitude for sport, especially for cross-country and jumping, as well as for the disciplines of classical and cowboy dressage. It has a gentle temperament, making it an ideal riding horse for riders of all levels.
- Training the Hispano-Arab horse requires a gentle and patient approach. The breed responds well to positive reinforcement and is known for its willingness to learn.
- The Hispano-Arab horse has a smaller constitution than the purebred Spanish horse and is more agile and athletic than the purebred Arabian horse.

The Andalusian horse, the Purebred Spanish Horse



The Andalusian horse, the Purebred Spanish Horse

- Weight: 412 - 512 kg
- Height at the withers: 152 - 172 cm
- Coat colors: bay, gray.
- Head - proportional, medium length, lean, with convex frontal profile, with minimal convexity of the frontal-nasal junction. Forehead - slightly wide and slightly convex. Eyes - lively, triangular in shape, with expressive gaze, orbital arches do not protrude beyond the front profile.
- They are of medium size, with a short back and a high-set curved neck. Horses of this breed have remarkable overall harmony and beauty, as well as powerful jumping ability. In character they are calm, sensitive, intelligent and quick to learn.
- Perfect short coat. Gray and bay colors predominate. The presence of white spots or excessive amounts of white on the head and limbs, or any other shape or size throughout the body are unacceptable traits for this breed. Other unacceptable traits are eyes of a different color or blue eyes that are not characteristic for coat color.
- Horses have a brilliant, agile, energetic, rhythmic and elastic stride and a supple, weighted and elegant trot.

The Arabian Purebred Horse



The Arabian Purebred Horse

- Weight: 360 - 450 kg
- Height at the withers: 145 - 155 cm
- Coat colors: bay, chestnut, gray, black.
- The Arabian horse has an oval muzzle, large, wide-set eyes and large nostrils on a graceful muzzle. They have graceful legs and strong hooves. Its most outstanding qualities are its tremendous stamina combined with speed, due to the fact that it was selected for the harsh desert environment. It is a breed that, due to its origins, is perfectly adaptable to any geographical area, even the harshest.
- Arabian horses are calm and affectionate. Their behavior makes them an ideal partner for humans. The horses are also incredibly clever.
- Arabian horses require the same care as other breeds and are low maintenance. They have an average life expectancy of 25-30 years.

The Menorquin Purebred horse



The Menorquin Purebred horse

- Weight: 400 - 500 kg
- Height at the withers: 155 - 165 cm.
- Coat colors: black.
- The purebred Menorquin horse is mainly characterized by a uniform black coat, although small white markings on the head and limbs are allowed if the exclusion criteria are met.
- This is a eumetric horse with a subconvex or straight profile, with slender and elongated limbs. Its constitution is strong and firm, females are more slender than males, with a more elongated head and body, a thinner and longer neck and a more square croup.
- These horses are easy and comfortable to ride, hardy and well adapted to rough roads. Their docile character and positive gait qualities have allowed them to quickly enter the sporting world as examples of the House of Menorquin dressage and classical dressage, in which they stand out in comparison to other Iberian breeds in national level competitions. They are also used for show jumping and driving.
